Post-Op Instructions: After Receiving a Veneer

If you have received this sheet, it is because you had a Veneer appointment today.

Here are some instructions to make sure you take care of yourself properly.

1. Your tooth was numbed today and you should avoid eating or drinking hot beverages until the feeling returns (1-1.5 hrs).
2. You can consume cold beverages. A smoothie is a great option for some nourishment.
3. Your tooth and gums will likely be sore for a few days due to being worked on.
4. You may want to consider swishing with some warm salt-water to cleanse the area.
5. Veneers take 2 visits to complete because your Veneer is being made by one of the top dental laboratories in the area specifically to fit your tooth and bite.
6. Veneers typically take about 1 to 2 weeks to be made. If we have provided a temporary Veneer is called a temporary Veneer because it is made from a soft acrylic material, and is put on your tooth with an intentionally weak adhesive, so that it can be taken off easily when it is time to put in the final Veneer.
7. Your temporary Veneer does not reflect the color, shape, or fit of the permanent Veneer.
8. Please take care of your Temporary Veneer Do not eat anything sticky or overly crunchy on these temporary Veneers. A sticky food like gum or sweets might pull it off the tooth. Something really crunchy like almonds might crack the material.
9. Do not eat anything sticky or overly crunchy on these temporary Veneers. A sticky food like gum or sweets might pull it off the tooth. Something really crunchy like almonds might crack the material.
10. When flossing the tooth with the temporary Veneer, floss down the tooth as normal, but instead of pulling your floss up and possibly dislodging the Veneer; pull your floss out to the side of the tooth.
11. If my temporary Veneer cracks or comes loose please contact the surgery ASAP. It is important to keep the temporary on your tooth to hold the tooth in place; otherwise your final Veneer not to fit.
12. If your temporary Veneer feel "high" or "tall" and hurts or feels weird to bite down on then please contact the surgery ASAP
13. When you receive your final Veneer, we will be removing your temporary and placing the final Veneer with a much stronger adhesive. You will then need to wait about 1-1.5 hours before eating.
14. You will need to care for this tooth like any other tooth, it needs to be brushed and flossed. The dental Veneer itself cannot get a cavity, but there is still tooth structure where the Veneer ends and your tooth begins again. You can get tooth decay there if you do not care for this tooth.
15. Like almost all dental treatment Veneers will usually eventually fail but can last a long time with proper care including regular examinations and effective personal dental hygiene. However, like any man made material, it will wear out with time and need replacement

REMEMBER if you have an emergency and you can't contact us and it involves

- Swelling effecting the throat, tongue or airway;**
- Blockage effecting the throat, tongue or airway;**
- Rashes anywhere on your body after treatment**
- Rashes anywhere on your body after taking medication**
- Severe pain**
- Bleeding that does not stop with pressure**
- Bleeding that continues for more than 2 hours after treatment**
- Bleeding that worries YOU**
